Share Your Voice with State Reps on 11/9!



At the Nov 9th PTA Board meeting, WA State Representatives Noel Frame and Liz Berry will join us from 7-7:30pm (on Zoom). Our district representatives are here to answer any questions from the Whittier community. We encourage families to use this time to ask questions or share your voice related to educational advocacy, including increased funding to promote inclusion and improve the operating budgets of our district schools.

As House representatives, both Reps Frame and Berry vote on state legislation, including education-related bills, but each Rep also has unique leadership roles on state committees. Rep Frame is the Chair of the House Finance Committee and Rep Berry is the Vice Chair of the Labor & Workplace Standards Committee. Both committees have a direct impact on our family's educational experience. Be sure to share your voice on Tuesday, Nov 9th!

SPS Covid Vaccination Opportunities

SPS is partnering with Public Health Seattle & King County to host COVID-19 vaccination clinics for students 5 years and older at many schools across the city. First-dose clinics will run from November 8 through November 23. Second-dose clinics will be offered from November 29 through December 14. The Pfizer vaccination requires two shots. Students should plan to be available for both school clinic dates to receive both doses of the vaccine

There are two types of school vaccine clinics that will be available: regional clinics and school-day clinics. 14 regional clinics will be held on weekends or evenings. Any SPS student 5 years and older can attend with their parent or guardian to receive either the pediatric dose for 5-11-year-olds or the regular


